

Privacy Policy

Our privacy policy outlines how Faiths Against Child Sexual Exploitation (FACES) collects and processes data.

How, what and why we collect, store and process data

We collect data through our website; job, volunteer, and training application forms; 'Keep in touch' signup sheets at events and activities; donation platforms, and; publicly available sources (ie. contact details available online).

We collect and store names, email addresses, telephone numbers in order to promote our activities, which includes advertising events. The legal basis for processing this data is based on **consent**; data subjects must opt-in to giving this data and are informed of the purposes of collecting it at the point of giving consent.

We collect and store names, email addresses, telephone numbers and organisation names in order to work in collaboration with other organisations, including funders. The legal basis for processing this data is based on **legitimate interest** (where it is necessary for us to collect such data to carry out our work) and/or **contractual** and/or **consent**.

Data is stored for as long as required to fulfil the purpose for which it was collected.

Data subject rights
